



Who we are

EURES has an important role to play in providing specific information and facilitating placements for the benefit of employers and frontier workers in European cross-border regions.

In practice, EURES delivers its services through the portal and through a human network of around 1 000 EURES advisers that are in daily contact with jobseekers and employers across Europe.

The network gathers representatives from all participating countries, Members and Partners, and the European Coordination Office (ECO).

Members and Partners in the network range from public to private employment services, trade unions, employers' organisations, and other relevant actors in the labour market.

Members and Partners provide information, placement and recruitment services to employers and jobseekers, whereas the European and National Coordination Offices oversee the organisation of the activities at European and national levels, respectively.



What can EURES offer you?

EURES helps jobseekers to find jobs and employers to recruit from all over Europe.

The European Union's principle of free movement of workers is one of your most important rights as an EU citizen. It means that you can move to any EU Member State, as well as Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, and Switzerland, to look for and take up a job as well as to recruit staff from any of these countries.

Yet, it may appear to be daunting and difficult to use this right. The purpose of EURES is precisely to help with an efficient, free public service for jobseekers and employers to search, find or match CVs to job vacancies.

This involves providing a broad range of services, available on the EURES portal or through the vast human network of more than a thousand advisers working in the EURES Member and Partner organisations.

EURES services to jobseekers and employers include:

- the EURES portal, where you can find 4 million jobs and 4 000 registered employers;
- support to dynamic recruitment events through the European (Online) Job Days platform;
- information, guidance, and other support services for workers and employers, by 1 000 EURES Advisers;
- information on living and working conditions in participating European states, such as taxation, pensions, health insurance and social security;
- specific support services for frontier workers and employers in crossborder regions;
- support to specific groups in the context of the EURES Targeted Mobility Schemes;
- information on and access to postrecruitment assistance, such as language training and support with integration in the destination country.
